1. Call to Order

- Approval of Minutes from January 19th, 2023 MEETING Jacqueline made the motion to approve the Minutes. Pete seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

- New Committee members introduction: Cecilia Salgado and Beverlee Cabral introduced themselves and shared their work experiences with the San Diego County Library system. They joined the committee in replacing Melissa Solis
- 7. 2022-2023 Workshop Planning

Updates:

- All the committee members announced the workshop in their library system
- Eventbrite Registration: committee discussed adding detailed information about the workshop to Eventbrite registration, and based on Azalea's experience with words and font limits on this platform, the committee decided to add detailed information about the workshop via emails for registration.

Budget:

- Patty Wong: Erwin mentioned Patty Wong's hotel and ticket had not been changed and the estimated cost would be around \$1000.
- Lunch <u>The Neighborhood Cafe</u> <u>Quote</u> (Monica)- Neighborhood Café: Erin shared the quote and menu that Monica provided. Their quote was around \$1000 for 75 lunch bags including one side. The vegan and gluten-free options were two options that the committee discussed to be added and followed up with them to include all types of diets for the workshop attendees. These options will be asked in the registration form to make all the attendee's diets are considered and will find out if we will have a request for those on their registration. Azalea added Vegan and Gluten- Free options.
- AM Breakfast <u>The Hamlet</u> <u>Quote</u> (Erin)AM Breakfast-The Hamlett Coffee Shop & Apothecary: Erin shared their quote and menu for Breakfast. They serve vegan breakfast Sandwiches, pastries, tea, and coffee as well. Their quote was around \$600. Gluten-free food was another subject that was discussed and providing the fruit tray as a Vegan option for participants.
 - ✓ Donut Touch: Jacqueline reached out to them and they provide 100 bagels and 100 donuts with cream cheese with a 10% discount for \$340.
 - ✓ Café X: Erin shared their prices and the information. Their menu looked expensive, and committee members preferred to follow up with The Hamlett for breakfast.

The Hamlett was the selected option by the committee, and Erin will follow up on that and will get a new quote for the bagels, cream cheese, and pastries.

- Afternoon Coffee/ tea and cake: committee discussed providing candy, and also coffee, and tea in the afternoon, and as an option, talking with the vendor who provides breakfast to bring coffee, tea, and something with it for the afternoon.
- Water and beverage: the committee discussed different possibilities for providing water, water bottle, and other options such as refilling the water out of existence water fountain at the workshop location and/or water jugs. Erwin mentioned the sparkling water from Costco, and Jacqueline asked/reminded the water and beverage with the lunch. Erin will make sure about the water and beverage with the lunch. Cecilia shared her experience in one event where they had Aqualine Water company provide water and cups for their event, and the attendees were informed that they can get cups and water at the Aqualine water stations Pete will ask if there would a possibility of providing water jugs through the SDPL.
- Raffle Prize: another item that needed to be considered at the budget line. It will be revisited later and will be checked with Monica, and Pete will follow up on that with the SDPL bookstore, Erin added a line for the raffle prize.
- Name badges: the name badges are the other item that Azar will follow up on and share the information with Erin. It has been added to the budget line

Land Acknowledgement:

• Azalea is working on it. She is thinking to make it more meaningful and engaging for the indigenous people, and she searched for Indigenous Mexican Dance Performer to add after the language lecture. She found Beatrice De Mora who is overseeing a nonprofit organization, worked on many advisory boards of indigenous communities and wrote a book and Ady helped her with her book. Beatrice mostly focuses on her book and the

indigenous community work that she is doing in her presentations. Azalea can ask her to work on welcoming statements and focus on her work with the indigenous community in San Diego, not her book. \$500 to \$1000 was the fee for her presentation that could be negotiated. The group that Beatrice is working with them will not be available on the day of the workshop.

The committee came to the idea of asking her to record a video of a 5-10-minute welcoming statement that explains the Land acknowledgment and approved a \$100 honorarium for her recorded video, and Azalea will follow up on the recorded video and the fee.

Erwin suggested making sure Serra's name of the indigenous group would not be associated with the SERRA committee. Azalea will work on that.

Library-Related Services and Programs

- Pete mentioned that he said Ady Huertas that we are hoping her presentation will be more practical examples in the library and sort of exercise workshopping. He did not finalize it and hammered it with her. Pete will inform the committee and will make sure of the time frame that Ady will need. Would it be between 30 minutes or she will need 40 minutes?
- Azalea- Social Worker presentation the social worker told Azalea that will inform her about the presentation soon. The social worker also is going to have an intersection to talk about social justice and social work. Azalea will talk with her to provide her presentation with more lived experiences and practical tips. It would be a 30 min time frame.
- Pete will talk with Ady about the break-out session and will inform the committee.
