**5. Connected CA**

Christian Theyer presented an overview of the Connected CA program. The program is free to all California residents and libraries. There are no obligations or requirements for public libraries to participate (no surveys or data requests) but they do request that libraries contact Christian to be added to the participating libraries list.

Digital Navigators are PT current and former library staff. Services are available in English and Spanish. Digital Navigators identify and connect patrons to resources such as classes, free or low cost devices and services, and job skills and job search programs. They also provide technology support and coaching.

Patrons can connect to a Digital Navigator via text, phone, email or webform.

Connected CA will send free outreach material such as flyers, bookmarks and social media images, messages.

**6. PressReader**

LA Times pulled out from PressReader- there have been no updates regarding our request to reinstate access.

LAPL reached out to their contacts at the LA Times. Updates will be sent when available.

There is a sizable additional charge to add The Economist to the PressReader subscription. Due to this extra charge SCLC declined to purchase The Economist at this time.

No discounts considered by PressReader due to lack of LA Times access. PressReader will announce a new publication that will be added to the catalog but is holding back on announcing the title.

The PressReader contract expires in October 2023.

## **7. Laptop Vending Machines and Charging Stations Grant Opportunities**

Various libraries shared their experience with laptop vending machines and the devices they circulate.

- Long Beach Library has had a Laptops Anytime vending machine in place for 6-8 months
- Santa Clarita Library is on its 3<sup>rd</sup> generation of Laptops Anytime machine. Laptops Anytime uses SIP. Devices don't leave the library and circulate in 2 hour increments. Used both Chromebooks and Windows but now on Windows only for the vending machines. The library purchases their own devices and Laptops Anytime customizes the bays. They currently use Gen 11 Dell core i5 laptops with Windows 10 and Office 2019.
- LA County has 30 vending machines with D tech. Support has been a challenge because it's a UK company. The bays are also a challenge for kids, people in wheelchairs and those who have to bend down. Patrons also have to reach in and unplug the computer from the power. Connects via SIP. Using Chromebooks in the machines.
- Santa Monica – Replaced 55 computer stations with charging towers. Must make a reservation (using Envisionware Cloud 9) for the table with the charging ports.
- Ventura County has 5 Laptops Anytime machines that are popular.

Discussion on pros/cons of using a laptop vending machine over staff time. Pros of vending machine – built in security; built in charging; SIP authentication. Cons of vending machine - maintenance and support can be cost prohibitive; space issues with the footprint.

Research whether we can use CLSA funds to purchase or support the set up or licensing cost of Google Management. Not interested in using funding for laptop vending machines at this time.

### Sierra Madre- Lori

- 10 million grant from state updating and expanding building, going from 9,000 SF to 3,000 SF temporary location
- Looking for tips and vendors to help with a move from a large building to a small building

#### El Segundo - Mark

- Received a Moving Forward grant to do repair work such as HVAC, elevator, moisture damage
- ILS going from Sierra to Polaris starting in April with an estimated completion in September
- Down a cataloger who is out on leave

#### City of Commerce - Edward

- New Library Director Sonia Bautista, internal candidate, goals to replace staff that they lost
- Migrating to Envisionware Cloud 9
- Senator Feinstein or Padilla grant tips needed by March 2

#### Ventura County Library – Amanda Armitage

- New Deputy Director, Ned Branch
- Middle of ILS migration to March 23 going from Horizon to Symphony
- Open+ grant funding for Fillmore location, launching in late April
- CLC grant funding to rewire Foster library – consolidating two network closets to one
- Mark Lager, IT Manager retired in May, and Amanda is new replacement

#### Monterey Park - Cathleen

- Recruiting Senior Librarians for Adult Services
- Cathleen new Senior Librarian for Tech Services
- Circulating hotspots – putting them on hold now and they are popular
- Expanding hours to evenings and looking to open on Mondays in the new fiscal year
- Looking for recommendations on photo library hosts

#### Glendora – Rochelle

- Sensory story time
- Hydroponic project
- New staff in support and public services – almost fully staffed
- Grab a Seat at the Southern Table online in March
- Spring Reading Challenge

#### Torrance - Craig

- Removed Minolta microfilm machine; got new ST4 and genealogy society loves it. Connects with OneDrive, USB etc.



#### Redondo – Tim

- Getting rolling on Open+ - hoping to have it done in a few months
- Joined Connected CA in January
- Hiring PT librarians

#### Burbank – Amanda Hogg

- Planning new Central Library building
- Joined Connected CA in January

#### Palos Verdes – Laszlo

- 30 new Chromebooks, 20 silverspots, 10 totspots, 40 hotspots
- Finishing the Annex for teens and now is built into main location, includes video games, monitors
- Done with wifi upgrade
- Security camera system upgrade is going to start

#### LA County – Binh

- ARPA money – adding 1,400 Chrombooks, up to 4,000 Chromebooks for checkout; extended wifi to parking lot in all locations should be complete by end of calendar year
- 10 renovations through ARPA, 10 through Build Back grant
- State Infrastructure Grant – proposed safety and security project that got approved \$18 million to put cameras, door access control, environmental sensors and PA systems in all locations, including regional and headquarters
- Moving towards Microsoft Teams Voice using Amazon Connect as distribution points at libraries 50% complete
- Renovating headquarters to include 100 bin material handling system

#### Pomona – Allan

- Restarting computer classes – keyboard, mouse, internet, privacy, security

#### Thousand Oaks – Rebecca

- Received a grant for Open+
